1st & 4th, Chequy Or and Azure a fess Ermine for CALTHORPE. 2nd Gules on a fess Argent between three boars' heads couped Or a lion passant Azure for GOUGH. 3rd Argent three piles Sable for ANSTRUTHER.



CALTHORPE Crest:

A boar's head couped at the neck Azure bristled and tusked Or between two woodmen with clubs over their shoulders all proper.

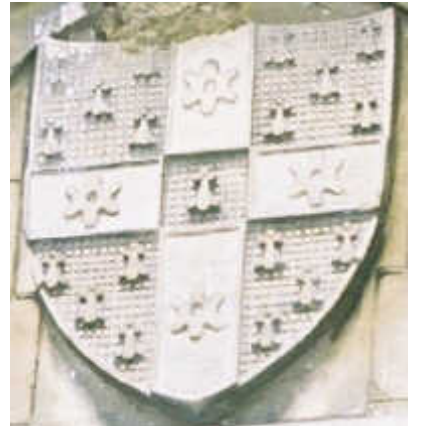

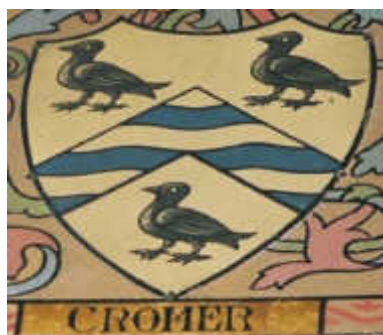

Argent a lion rampant

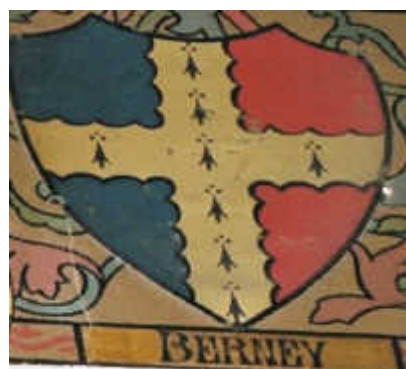
Azure a cinquefoil pierced ermine within a bordure engrailed Or.

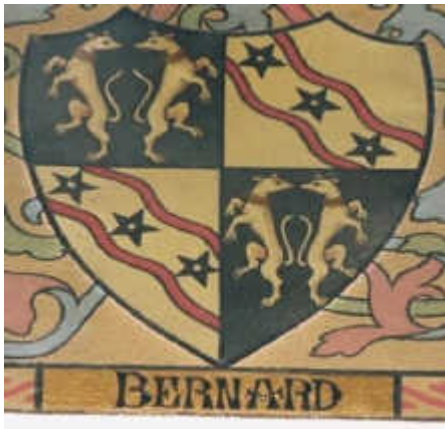


HARRIS:

Gules two lions passant in pale Argent overall a bend Or.

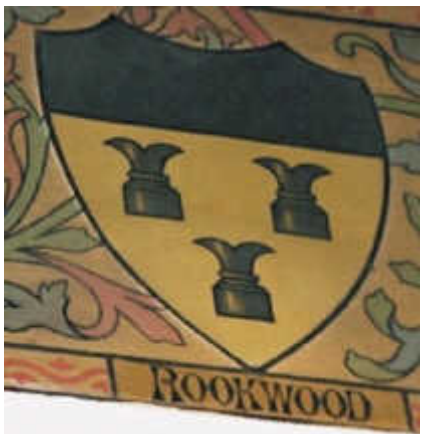

Azure a chevron Or between three lions' heads erased Or.

## HEATH:

Argent a cross engrailed between twelve billets Gules.

**Heath** (Brasted, co. Kent, Lyndsfield and Tanridge, co. Surrey; from the Surrey family derived Sir ROBERT HEATH, Lord Chief Justice of the Common Pleas). Ar. a cross engr. betw. twelve billets gu. *Crest*—A wolf's head erased per pale sa. and or, ducally gorged ar. holding in the mouth a bro' en spear of the second, headed of the third.

## SMITH:

Gules on a chevron Or between three bezants as many crosses pattee fitchy Sable (a martlet for difference). [BGA]

**Smith** (Kilnchurch, co. Leicester, bart., earlier 1721; Sir EDWARD SMITH, Bart., of Kilnchurch, descended from FRANK SMITH, Reg., of Bevelly, whose ancestor, WILLIAM SMITH, of Walsby, same co., assumed the name of SMITH, temp. Henry VII, was so crested 1561). Gu. on a chev. or, betw. three bezants as many crosses pattee fitchy sa. *Crest*—Duc of a ducal coronet or, an Indian goat's head erased sa. torse gold.



## GARNEYS:

Argent a chevron engrailed Azure between three escallops Sable.

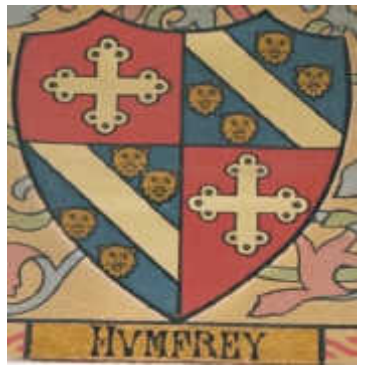
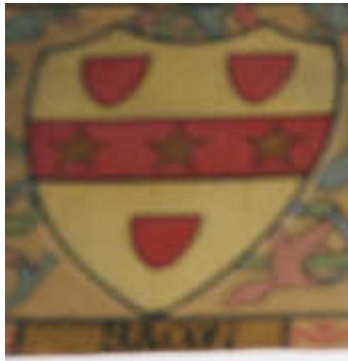

Funeral hatchment for Frederick, 4th Baron Calthorpe, who married in 1823, Charlotte Sophia, daughter of Henry Charles, 6th Duke of Beaufort, and died 2nd May 1868.

Quarterly; 1st, Chequy Or and Azure a fess Ermine (Calthorpe), 2nd, Ermine a maunch Gules (Calthorpe), 3rd, Gules on a fess between three boars' heads couped Or a Lion passant Azure (Gough), 4th, Argent three pallets Gules over all a chevron Azure charged with three trefoiles slipped Or (Carpenter), over all the Badge of Ulster, impaling quarterly France and England, a bordure com-pony wavy Argent and Azure (Somerset).





Funeral hatchment (probably) for Charles, 2nd Baron Calthorpe who died unmarried 5th June 1807.

Tierced in pairle 1st, Chequy Or and Azure a fess Ermine (Calthorpe), 2nd, Ermine a maunch Gules (Calthorpe), 3rd, Gules on a fess between three boars' heads coupéd Or a lion passant Azure (Gough) centre chief the Badge of Ulster.
